

## Fresno Coaltion for Digital Inclusion (FCDI) Policy Agenda

- Comprehensive data gathering on internet access and speed ensures genuine and community-informed representation of digitally unserved and underserved populations.
- The actual fiber optic cable infrastructure needed for internet connectivity known as the "middle mile" is routed to reach unserved rural populations.
   Middle-mile cable is available to multiple internet providers (open access) in underserved areas of urban poverty and multi-dwelling units.
- Through better data collection and unrestricted access to fiber optic cable the equity gap is reduced by improving services for the underserved through competition and choice.
- Solutions which bring internet connections to people across their daily journey-at home, at work, and everywhere in between, known as the "last mile" are affordable and fast to deploy (like LTE cellular networks) while bringing fiber optic cable as close to people as possible.
- Many more people are able to connect to and use the internet and overall
  internet adoption is improved through funding of services and building of
  capacity to provide support and literacy training.
- A regional exchange is constructed in Fresno to bring faster, less expensive internet to businesses and people.
- Anchor institutions share internet assets where possible and stretch investment funds to reach those with unmet needs.
